

BRIEF REPORT ON ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED ON 19TH AUGUST 2015- THE WORLD HUMANITARIAN DAY AT THE ASSEMBLY OF GOD HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL (NIOS AI-150013/410119), JHARSUGUDA

MITRA- The Adolescent Friendly Centre of NIOS Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar organized “Induction Programme for NIOS Learners”, “Workshop on Growing Up”, “Slogan Writing” and “Orientation of Coordinator and Tutors on Life Skill Education” on 19th August 2015- The World Humanitarian Day at The Assembly of God Higher Secondary School, Jharsuguda (NIOS AI No-150013/410119).

A total of 64 learners, 5 Coordinators and 5 tutors from 3 Study Centres participated in the programme. The programme started with welcoming the learners, coordinators and tutors by Sri Sambit Mishra, SEO, NIOS.

The Induction Programme was conducted by Sri Aditi Ranjan Rout who elaborated on NIOS, its features and flexibilities, importance of PCP and TMA and making the best use of SLM and role of the learner being “A Self Learner”. The important dates for submission of TMA, Examination Fees were also discussed. The “Induction Programme” ended with an open question-answer session.
